Terrorist Regime Armed with Nukes

Washington Post, April 12, 2006 - "I'm announcing officially that Iran has now joined the countries that have nuclear technology," Ahmadinejad said in a carefully staged presentation televised live across Iran.



Daily Telegraph, October 27, 2005 - "The establishment of the Zionist regime was a move by the world oppressor against the Islamic world," he said. "As the Imam [Khomeini] said, 'Israel must be wiped off the map'..."

CNN, October 27, 2005 –Ahmadinejad stated "And God willing, with the force of God behind it, we shall soon experience a world without the United States and Zionism," according to a quote published by Iran's state news outlet, the Islamic Republic News Agency.

Agence France Presse, September 14, 2005 - Several thousand Iranian exiles protested in front of the UN headquarters here Wednesday, denouncing Iranian President Mahmoud Ahmadinejad as a "terrorist".

"Iranians think Ahmadinejad is not their representative, he's a terrorist," said Bahman Badiee of the Iran Society of South Florida.



CBS News, September 14, 2005 - When Ahmadinejad was granted a visa to enter the United States in order to attend the U.N. summit, many Iranian-Americans were outraged. A group of them came together to form the New York Committee Against Ahmadinejad (NYCA). "The rally calls for a firm and resolute policy by the U.S. and the international community in the face of the growing threat of the Iranian regime," the NYCA stated in its policy goals. "This policy must reject both appeasement and foreign war in favor of support for Iranian people and organized resistance."

Solution to Iranian Dilemma

As the Iranian dilemma takes center stage in the international arena, the Iranian people have offered their solution. The answer is neither a foreign invasion, nor appeasement of the Mullahs, the only true solution is democratic change brought about by the Iranian people and their just resistance, the National Council of Resistance of Iran (NCRI), the same Resistance which revealed Iran's nuclear program to the world in August 2002.

No War, No Talks; Why?

No one would like to witness another war in the region, thus all will agree that military intervention is not the solution to Iran

As Mrs. Rajavi stated in the European Council on April 10th:

- Three years of negotiations and appeasement of the ruling theocracy gave the mullahs the opportunity to acquire the needed time to advance and complete their nuclear weapons program.
- The mullahs seek to acquire atomic weapons as a lever to preserve the religious dictatorship.
- Nuclear weapons are effective tools to export of Islamic fundamentalism and terrorism.

We are speaking about a regime which has executed 120,000 people for political reasons and has violated the most fundamental rights of the Iranian people. The regime has also assassinated dozens of Iranian dissidents abroad and international arrest warrants have been issued for the arrest of a number of high ranking government officials. On the other hand the danger of the Iranian regime's meddling and terrorism in Iraq is a hundred times more dangerous than its nuclear threat.

The Iranian regime has in recent weeks stepped up pressures and torture against political prisoners. The regime's henchmen had threatened that if the regime's nuclear file were referred to the UN Security Council, they would kill all political prisoners with relations to the People's Mojahedin (Iran's main opposition force), as they did in the summer of 1988, where 30,000 political prisoners were massacred in a matter of months. On February 7, 2006, Hojjat Zama ni, 31, was hanged after tolerating intense physical and psychological torture in prison for four and a half years. And Valiollah Feiz-Mahdavi has been told that he will be executed on May 16th.

In order to confront such a regime, the world, must act decisively and quickly. The Security Council must impose sanctions on the regime and the international community must recognize the right of the Iranian people to resist for freedom.
